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Appendix 1

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Work entries:

Each entry in the catalogue includes composer name and dates (where known); work title; instrumentation (in the order that it appears on the autograph or first edition).

Then follows (where applicable):

Date: Dating, followed by source of dating (see Abbreviations). A precise date of completion may appear on an autograph, but typically the date may be the *terminus ante quam*, deducible from advertisement and/or publication of the first edition. Where the dating of a work is problematic, giving rise to conflicting evidence from secondary sources, both or several of the proposed datings are presented.

Dedication: Dedication as it appears on the autograph and/or first edition.

Incipits: Incipits of openings of all movements from multi-movement works, which may include openings of other major sections of music, or incipits of major sections of music of works which do not have multi-movement structures. Movement/work durations in bars are included at the end of the incipit. Metronome marks are given where they appear in the earliest source. Phrase markings but not dynamic markings are included. Unless otherwise stated, incipits are taken from the first-named source (see *Location/s*).

Autograph: Bibliographic report on composer autograph with *Location* (see below).

First edition: Bibliographic report on the earliest available printed edition. Dating, and source of dating of first edition (e.g. 1805/AmZ); RISM reference (where applicable). Includes title page details; collation; part details; plate numbers.

Advertisement: Source/s of contemporary advertisement/s in newspapers, periodicals, catalogues etc. appear chronologically. Cost of work included (where applicable).

Review: Source/s of contemporary review/s in newspapers, periodicals etc. appear chronologically. Cost of work included (where applicable).

Location/s: Extant complete and incomplete sources known to the author. Unless otherwise stated, incipits and work details (see above) are taken from the first-named source here; other sources appear alphabetically by library siglum.

Later editions: Significant later editions with selected information from the above template.

Notes: Other relevant work information that does not belong under the above headings.

Notes:

The firm of Riedl (Kunst und Industrie Comptoir) published the Sonata, Op.10 no.2 (1805), Quintet, Op.41 (1808), Potpourri, Op.44 (1808) and Sextet, Op.47 (1808). Riedl closed in May 1823, the music publishing rights transferring to S.A.Steiner & Co., who brought out editions from the old plates but with new title pages and the mark ‘S.u.C.H.’. Meysel 1823 lists a ‘New Edition’ of Op.10 published by Steiner in Vienna. The work still appeared in Meysel 1828 (price: 3 Fl. 30 Xr) under the name of Steiner’s successor Haslinger. Given that there are extant copies of new editions by Steiner of Op.41 (pn 4165), Op.44 (pn 4168) and Op.47 (pn 4171) it is likely that the Sonata did appear from this publisher, although no extant copy is known.
