## **Literature Review**

- The UK HESA stats on p30: can these be contextualised in relation to the % of high school leavers entering university? It is not helpful to have stand-alone figures for racial groups as % of the university population, without knowing what % of the national population they are. Is it also possible to add comparable UK figures to the USA ones stated just beforehand?
  - Added in contextual information about secondary school leaver population by race in the UK on page 30: "These statistics loosely reflect the percentage of UK state-funded secondary school leavers by race: In the 2016 academic year, 76.3% of students were white (either British or non-British), 10.3% were Asian, 5.5% were Black, and 4.7% were mixed race (Department for Education, 2016)." This addresses both parts of the reviewer questions.
  - Also added in the full reference for the in-text citation in the above sentence on page 316.

## Findings Chapters 1 and 4:

- The meaning of the phrase 'fire him for cause' (on. p.120 and 221) this must be from the US context as both examiners are unclear what this implies.
  - Added in a footnote (footnote 13) on page 122 in the first use of this phrase with a legal definition, which reads: "Termination of a tenured professor for cause refers to breaking an unending employment contract with a faculty member based on the breaching of specific criteria (often defined by each university) that can cover performance-related issues as well as moral and ethical issues (Euben, 2004)." Added in a footnote (footnote 28) on page 218 referring back to footnote 13 and to the source itself.
  - Also added in the full reference for the in-text citation (footnote 13) on page 317.
