

The Material Culture of Drinking and the Construction of Social Identities in the Seventeenth-Century Dutch Republic

Volume II

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Abstract

After gaining their independence, the seventeenth-century Northern Netherlands experienced a Golden Age of wealth and prosperity. However, there was not yet a sense of national unity, and changes in society, politics, wealth and world view all created flux in identity. Drinking was both a fundamental and yet also highly charged activity, taking place in the home, taverns, and at events such as weddings. Playing a vital role in hospitality and community bonding, drinking became an important activity in the communication of developing identities, affiliations and Dutch national feeling.

This thesis examines material culture gathered from domestic cesspits dating between 1500 and 1800 from across the Dutch Republic, to determine which aspects of identity may have been communicated through drinking vessels.

Archaeological assemblages of vessels were used to create status profiles, a method of comparing artefact groups to identify the status of the household. The quantities of high quality glassware proved to be the most diagnostic feature of status until the eighteenth century when ceramics became more highly sought. Different types of sites, like hospitals and taverns, also presented a distinct profile of material. Regional differences in drinking practice, however, were not found to be distinct, with wealth, status and era having more effect.

Vessels and drinks were tied up in a system of conspicuous consumption, status and display, which could be both desirable and dangerous. Vessels and drinking were used to create ceremonies of hospitality and inclusion, or to promote regional pride, or make politico-religious criticism. Vessels were personalised for gift giving, or to display status and belonging through heraldry, names or symbology. Vessels, including glass, earthenware and porcelain, also held a didactic function, warning of the dangers of excess and luxury, and promoting moral decency and domestic harmony, particularly for women. These behaviours, combined with the use of Dutch imagery, helped to confirm a new sense of national unity.

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This volume contains the artefact illustrations for the primary results chapters (chapters four to ten), and four appendices. The chapter numbering has been retained to allow direct comparison between the volumes. The table of contents for volume I can be found at the beginning of that volume.

The illustrations in this volume were all drawn or photographed by the author, unless an alternate source has been referenced in the caption.





Fig. 4.1. (3a). Redware cup, (r-kop-2, DURS05165).




Fig. 4.1. (4). Redware cup, (r-kop-20, DURS05163). At scale 2:3.





Fig. 4.1. (7). Redware jug, (r-kan-27, DURS05175). Scale 1:3.




Fig. 4.1. (9). Faience teacup, (f-kop-2, DURS05133). Scale 1:1.





Fig. 4.1. (13). Faience teacup, (f-kop-1, DURS05138). Scale 1:1.





Fig. 4. 1. (16). Miniature faience jug. (f-min-, DURS05139).




Fig. 4. 1. (22a). Redware cup, (r-kop-20, DURS05151).




Fig. 4. 1. (22e). Redware cup, (r-kop-20, DURS05147).




Fig. 4. 1. (24). Redware jug with a malformed base preventing the vessel from standing flat, (r-kan-15, DURS05149). Scale 2:3.





Fig. 4. 1. (26). Raspberry prunted roemer, (gl-roe-15, DURS0584).




Fig. 4. 1. (30). "Tear" patterned *knobbelbeker* in soda glass vessel, (gl-bek-12, DURS0577).




Fig. 4. 1. (37). Redware drinking cup, (r-kop-2, DURS05219).




Fig. 4. 1. (42). Soda glass goblet, (gl-kel-11, DURS05125).




Fig. 4.1. (44). Redware cup, (r-kop- , DURS05179).




Fig. 4. 1. (49a). Redware bowl, decorated with a stylized stag, (r-kom-36, DURS05211).






Fig. 4. 1. (50). Redware bowl (r-kom-57, DURS05212).





Fig. 4. 1. (53). Whiteware cup, (w-kom-15, DURS05215). Scale 2:3.





Fig. 4. 1. (55). Faience *papkom* bowl, (f-kom-10, DURS05229). Scale 2:3.




Fig. 4. 1. (57). Wafelbeker, (gl-bek-19a, DURS0521). Scale 2:3.





Fig. 4. 1. (59). *Vetro a fili* glass with thin diagonal white lines and blue rim, (gl-bek-9, DURS0528).




Fig. 4. 1. (62). Goblet, probably baluster stemmed, (gl-kel- , DURS0510). Scale 1:1.




Fig. 4. 1. (66). Beaker decorated with white glass ribs, (gl-bek-35b, DURS05101).




Fig. 4. 1. (70). Whiteware cup, (w-kop-13, DURS05177).






Fig. 4. 1. (73a). Faience *papkomen*, (m-kom-5, DURS05130).




Fig. 4. 1. (78) and (79). “Knotted snake” stemmed goblet with blue decoration, (gl-kel-65, DURS0529). Scale 1:1.




Fig. 4. 1. (83). Faience teacup, (f-kop-2, DVKS8101). Scale 1:1.




Fig. 4. 1. (87). Waffle patterned beaker (gl-bek-19a, DVKS8104).





Fig. 4. 1. (91). Beaker with thin spiralled thread (gl-bek-33b, DVK8152).




Fig. 4. 1. (95). Roemer with raspberry prunts (gl-roe-2, DVKS8121).




Fig. 4. 1. (100). Goblet with ribbed nodule stem (gl-kel-13, DVKS8162).




Fig. 4. 1. (103). Goblet with stem formed of a coiled ribbed thread, with applied blue wings, (gl-kel- , DVKS8172). After Meijer:1984:11.




Fig. 4. 1. (105). *Vetro a fili* beaker, (gl-bek-9, DONG8612).






Fig. 4. 1. (107). Thick walled beaker, (gl-bek-6, DONG8613).





Fig. 4. 1. (110). Round pruned roemer, (gl-roe-9, DONG8605).




Fig. 4. 1. (112). Soda glass goblet with a hollow inverted baluster stem in the *façon d'Angleterre* style, (gl-kel- , DONG8638).





Fig. 4. 2. (4). Faience cup (f-kop-9, HOWIN0432). Scale 1:1.




Fig. 4. 2. (6). Beakers with round prunted feet (gl-bek-14, HOWIN0418).




Fig. 4. 2. (9). *Roemer* with flattened raspberry prunts (gl-roe-2, HOWIN0402).




Fig. 4. 2. (14). Miniature whiteware cup (w-kop-33, HOBRU9014).





Fig. 4. 2. (18). Small spirit glass (gl-kel-, HOBRU9005). Scale 1:1.





Fig. 4.2. (21). Fragments of Portuguese Faience from a jug (po-kan-, HOKHS0907). After Schrickx 2011:55.




Fig. 4. 2. (29). Porcelain cup (p-kop-14, HOKKL9516). Scale 1:1.




Fig. 4. 2. (32). Raspberry prunt with a blue bead from a beaker (gl-bek-34b, HOKKL9501). Not to scale.

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


Fig. 4. 3. (7) Porcelain cup decorated with screens and floral patterns (p-kom-9, ENEBF9414).




Fig. 4. 3. (10a) Blue threaded *pasglas* (gl-bek-34b?, ENEBF9401). Scale 1:2.





Fig. 4. 3. (16a). Stoneware Baartman jug (s2-kan-44, ENTS0811) Scale 2:1.


Fig. 4. 3. (21). Porcelain saucer decorated with sea life (p-kom-8, ENTS0851).





Fig. 4. 3. (27). *Roemer* with thorned prunts. (gl-roe-10, ENTS0870) Scale 2:3.

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


Fig. 4. 3. (29). Soda stangenglas with milled blue threads (gl-sta-5, ENTS0869).




Fig. 4. 3. (31) Baluster stemmed soda glass goblet (gl-kel-11, ENTS0854). Scale 1:1.




Fig. 4. 3. (35). Engraved goblet (gl-kel-11, ENTS0876). Scale 1:1.




Fig. 4.3. (36). Engraved doves on pierced hearts (ENTSO876).




Fig. 5. 1. (3). Westerwald jug (s2-kan-33, AHMUS0317) Scale 1:3.





Fig. 5. 1. (10). Vetro-a-fili beaker, (gl-bek-9a, AHMUS0333). Scale 1:1.




Fig. 5. 1. (16). Dated slipware bowl, (r-kop-11, AHMUS0304). Scale 1:2.




Fig. 5. 1. (17c). Redware cup, (r-kop-36, AHMUS0307).




Fig. 5. 1. (30). Forest and soda glass from Wever-Bakkerstraat, clockwise from top left: AHWB7819 (gl-roe-6), AHWB7820 (gl-bek-12b), AHWB7816 (gl-ber-1), 2 x AHWB7817 (gl-roe-2), AHWB7822, (gl-bek-15a) and AHWB7818 (gl-roe-10).




Fig. 5. 1. (34). Goblet with stem formed from red and clear twisted threads in a figure-of-eight with blue pinched wings, (gl-kel-34, AHWE8511).





Fig. 5. 1. (45). Stoneware Cologne jug (s2-kan-73, AHBT8223). Scale 3: 4.




Fig. 5. 1. (48). Trechterbekers from Koningstraat. From left AHKON1810, AHKON1813, AHKON1811 and AHKON1812. All of type s2-tre-1, except AHKON1813 (s2-tre-5).




Fig. 5. 1. (51). Dark red beaker with rosette prunts and milled threads, (gl-bek-8, AHKON1802). Scale 1:1.




Fig. 6. 1. (3). Redware cup with internal yellow lead glaze, (r-kop-, LWSM7824). Scale 1:2.




Fig. 6. 1. (10). Eighteenth-century lead glass lid, with a solid handle ring, (gl-dek-10, LWSM7832).




Fig. 6. 1. (13). Base of a weserware jug with red and green slip decoration, (we-kan- , LWSM8241). Scale 1:1.




Fig. 6. 1. (15). Stoneware jug with pewter hinge attached, (s2-kan- , LWSM8242). Scale 2:3.




Fig. 6. 1. (18). Stoneware jug, (s2-kan-, LWSM8223).

Fig. 6. 1. (19). Soda glass *knobbelbeker* (gl-bek-12a, LWSM8207). Scale 1:1.





Fig. 6. 1. (20). Large green glass beaker, (gl-bek-32, LWSM8213). Scale 3:4.

Fig. 6. 1. (21). *Façon de Venise* beaker lid with waffle patterning (gl-dek-, LWSM8209). Scale 1:1.





Fig. 6. 1. (22). Pruned *berkemeier* (gl-ber-1, LWSM8211). Scale 1:1.




Fig. 6. 1. (25). Redware cup, (r-kop-2, LWPH8411). Scale 1:2.





Fig. 6. 1. (29). Redware cup with internal lead glaze, (r-kop-17, LWAK0210).




Fig. 6. 1. (31). Base and foot of Westerwald stoneware jug, (s2-kan-37, LWAK0203).





Fig. 6. 1. (32). Forest glass *nuppenbeker* with small prunts, (gl-bek-53, LWAK0201).




Fig. 7. 1. (3). Whiteware double handed cup with yellow lead glaze, (w-kop-27, UACB7507). Scale 2: 3.

Fig. 7. 1. (4). Blue and white glazed Westerwald stoneware jug with intact pewter lid, (S2- kan-14, UACB7501.).




Fig. 7. 1. (5a) and (5b). Lid and body detailing of UACB7501. Scale 2:3.





Fig. 7. 1. (8). White earthenware cup with green lead glaze, (w-kop-16, UJMS7907). Scale 2:3.

Fig. 7. 1. (9). Small redware cup with internal and external yellow lead glaze, (r-kop-4, UJMS7914). Scale 1:1.





Fig. 7. 1. (10a) and (10b). Waisted red earthenware handled beakers, decorated with thick yellow lead glaze stripes, (r-bek-5, UJMS7906). Scale 1:1.




Fig. 7. 1. (13a). Stoneware jug decorated with blue and purple glaze, applied floral shaped and applied medallion, (UJMS7911). Scale 2:3.

Fig. 7. 1. (13b). Applied medallion with coat-of-arms with three herrings and surround text, from vessel UJMS7911.




Fig. 7. 1. (14). Faience tea cup decorated with Chinese style scenery (f-kop-1, UJMS7916).





Fig. 7. 1. (18). Knobbelbeker (gl-bek-12a, UJMS7902). Scale 1:1




Fig. 7. 1. (20a). Vetro a fili beaker with rosettes and gilded grotesque masks, (gl-bek-9a, UJMS7904). Scale 1:1.

Fig. 7. 1. (20b). Gilded grotesque mask from beaker, (gl-bek-9a, UJMS7904). Scale 2:1.





Fig. 7. 1. (21a). Pewter *papkom* with crowned rose stamp, (UJMS7908). Scale 2:3.




Fig. 7. 1. (23). Stoneware jug with Chaste Susanna imagery, (s2-kan-49, UWAL9475).

Fig. 7. 1. (24). Whiteware jug with lead glaze, (w-kan-2, UWAL9466). Scale 2:3.




Fig. 7. 1. (25). Stoneware jug with floral decoration, (s2-kan-71, UWAL9474). Scale 1:1.





Fig. 7. 1. (27). Beaker with waffle pattern, (gl-bek-12b, UWAL9435).




Fig. 7. 1. (29). Beaker applied milled threads and rosette prunts, (gl-bek-34a, UWAL9424).




Fig. 7. 1. (31). Miniature beaker with honeycomb pattern and blue prunt feet, (gl-bek-15b, UWAL9426). Scale 1:1.




Fig. 7. 1. (34). Lid from a highly decorated beaker, with applied gilded masks and rosette prunts with blue beads, (gl-dek- , UWAL9442).





Fig. 7. 1. (35b). Gilded Neptune mask from beaker lid, (gl-dek- , UWAL9442). Not to scale.




Fig. 7. 1. (40a and b). Roemer with engraved musical stave and song in French and with engraved base, (UWAL9465, gl-roe-9).





Fig. 7. 1. (42a). Engraved berkemeier, (gl-ber-1, UWAL9411). Scale 1:1.




Fig. 7.1. (44). Baluster stemmed goblet, (gl-kel-38, UWAL9454).




Fig. 7. 1. (48). Snake-stemmed goblet with wings, (gl-kel-65, UWAL9450).




Fig. 7.1. (53). Polychrome glass bowl, (gl-kom-2, UWAL9462). Scale 1:1.




Fig. 7. 1. (56). Redware cup (r-kop-2, UNIE0307). (After van Veen 2010:17).




Fig. 7. 1. (59). Whiteware cup with green and yellow lead glaze, (w-kop-3, UNIE0312). (After van Veen 2010:22).





Fig. 7. 1. (61). Redware jug with lead glaze (r-kan-33, UNIE0304). (After van Veen 2010:16).




Fig. 7.1. (63). Artists reconstruction of Majolica *papkorn* with cross design and I.H.S. monogram in blue and yellow, (m-kom-9, UNIE0313). (After van Veen 2010:26, 30).




Fig. 7. 1. (66). *Wafelbeker* (gl-bek-19a, UNIE0321). Scale 1:1. (After van Veen 2010:94).





Fig. 7. 1. (69). Forest glass *nuppenbeker*, (gl-bek-54, UNIE0320). Scale 1:1. (After van Veen 2010:94).





Fig. 7. 1. (72). Stoneware jug decorated with medallions and salt glaze (s2-kan-32, UGBW9835). Scale 1:2.





Fig. 7. 1. (78). Forest glass *berkemeier*, (gl-ber-1, UGBW9803). Scale 1:1.




Fig. 8. 1. (3). Beaker with red, white and blue *vetro a fili* twisted threads with gilded lion mask prunts (gl-bek-9a, DRCE9112). Scale 1:1.




Fig. 8. 1 (6). Goblet with *mezza stampaura* ribs and baluster stem, (gl-kel-36, DRCE9108).




Fig. 9. 1. (4). Stoneware “P” *kruik* mineral water bottle, (s2-fle-11, GRS9102).




Fig. 9. 1. (6). Fragment of porcelain cup, (p-kop-12, GRSH9113).




Fig. 9. 1. (11). Whiteware cup with yellow lead glaze (w-kop-6, GRSS8428).





Fig. 9.1. (16). Footed porcelain dish with painted patterns, (p-kop-4, GRSS8421). Scale 1:1




Fig. 9. 1. (18). Cylindrical *stangenglas* with blue threads, (gl-sta-5, GRSS8407). Scale 1:1.




Fig. 9.1. (21). Beaker with a thin waffle pattern, (gl-bek-19a, GRST9305).

Fig. 9.1. (22). Beaker with knobbed pattern, (gl-bek-15b, GRST9307). Both at scale 1:1.





Fig. 9. 1. (23). Beaker with knobbed pattern and blue prunt feet, (gl-bek-15b, GRST9306)




Fig. 9. 1. (29). Redware cup with colourless lead glaze, (r-kop-10, GRSJ1001). Scale 2:3.




Fig. 9. 1. (31). Eight-sided porcelain bowl, (p-kom-5, GRSJ1002). Scale 1:1.





Fig. 9. 1. (34). Redware cup with colourless internal glaze, (r-kop-10, GRWNC9024).





Fig. 9. 1. (36). Double-handled *papkom* style bowl with yellow and green glaze, (w-kop-7, GRWNC9023). (After van Gangelen and Helfrich 1992:300).





Fig. 9. 1. (38). A reconstruction of complete porcelain *kraakoppen* tea cup. The original fragments are decorated with birds and flowers (p-kop-10, GRWNC9028). After van Gangelen and Helfrich 1992:308). Not to scale.

Fig. 9. 1. (39). Network beaker with a waved foot ring, (gl-bek-10, GRWNC9017). Scale 3:4.





Fig. 9.1. (40). Beaker with applied ribs, (gl-bek-46, GRWNC9012).




Fig. 9.1. (42). Beaker with applied milled blue glass threads, (gl-bek-33, GRWNC9003).





Fig. 9. 1. (44). Roemer with thorned prunts, (gl-roe-6, GRWNC9001).




Fig. 9. 1. (47). Baluster stemmed goblet with vertical ribs, (gl-kel-37, GRWNC9015).




Fig. 9. 1. (49). Goblet with a polychrome spiral stem, (gl-kel-60, GRWNC9009). Scale 1:1.





Fig. 10. 1. (3). Redware bowl, (r-kop-3, DBBM89116).




Fig. 10. 1. (5). Whiteware cup, (w-kop-1, DBBM89118). Scale 2:3.




Fig. 10. 1. (9). Whiteware bowl (?w-kop-26, DBBM89143).




Fig. 10. 1. (12). Redware jug, (r-kan-?, DBBM8995).




Fig. 10. 1. (15). Stoneware jug, (s2-kan-33, DBBM89125). Scale 1:2.




Fig. 10. 1. (23). Porcelain bowl with floral scenery and crow decoration, (p-kom-8, DBBM8994).





Fig. 10. 1. (27). Beaker with gold enamel *fleur-de-lis* (gl-bek-8, DBBM8913). Not to scale.




Fig. 10. 1. (38). Jug or carafe with a curled handle and a long spout (gl-kan-3, DBBM89145). Not to scale.




Fig. 10. 1. (40). Redware cup with green glaze, (r-kop-14, DBVO9349).





Fig. 10. 1. (44). Redware jug, (r-kan-26, DBVO9351).




Fig. 10. 1. (48). Faience cup, (f-kop-1, DBVO9352).





Fig. 10. 1. (51). Forest glass beaker with knobbed pattern (gl-bek-12a, DBVO9329).






Fig. 10. 1. (54). Redware cup (r-kop-35, DBHTK00339a).




Fig. 10. 1. (57). Small redware jug with yellow slip decoration, (r-kan-12, DBHTK00344).





Fig. 10. 1. (59). Stoneware jug with merchant's medallion, (s2-kan-55, DBHTK00256). To scale 1:2.




Fig. 10. 1. (63). Small stoneware jug, (s2-kan-30, DBHTK00333).




Fig. 10. 1. (65). Late seventeenth to mid-eighteenth-century Batavia ware porcelain cups from Keizershof. Not to scale.




Fig. 10. 1. (68). Porcelain spirit cup, (p-kop-3, DBHTK00240). Scale 1:1.





Fig. 10. 1. (72). Thick based eighteenth century beaker with ribs (gl-bek-38, DBHTK0028).




Fig. 10.1. (74). Ribbed knobbelbeker, (gl-bek-15b, DBHTK00225).





Fig. 10. 1. (77). *Roemer* with large flat prunts, (gl-roe-9, DBHTK00238).




Fig. 10. 1. (83). Eighteenth-century lead glass goblet, (gl-kel-1, DBHTK0020).




Fig. 10. 1. (86). Late seventeenth-century soda glass goblet, (gl-kel-8 DBHTK0078).




Fig. 10. 1. (93). Nodule stemmed goblet, (gl-kel-11 DBHTK0076).




Fig. 10. 1. (96). Goblet with ribbed nodule stem, (gl-kel-13, DBHTK00193). Scale 1:1.




Fig. 10. 1. (99). Snake stemmed goblet with blue wings, (gl-kel-34, DBHTK00168). Scale 1:1.




Fig. 10. 1. (103). Figure-of-eight goblet with blue turns and prunts, (gl-kel-34 DBHTK0051).




Fig. 10. 1. (106a) and (106b). Goblet with stem formed from a twisted ribbed thread, topped with blue wings and seahorse head, (gl-kel-95 DBHTK00153). Both to scale 1:1.




Fig. 10. 1. (108). Goblet with *mezza stampaura* ribs, (gl-kel-48, DBHTK0063).




Fig. 10. 1. (112). Eight-sided goblet with missing stem, (gl-kel-, DBHTK00176). To scale 1:2.





Fig. 10. 1. (114). Forest glass jug with wide frilled foot ring and ribs, (gl-kan-, DBHTK0071).

Fig. 10. 1. (115). Narrow necked bottle or flask, (gl-kan-, DBHTK00182). Scale 1:1.




Fig. 10.1. (116). Thick walled neck from a jug, with three thick horizontal rings (gl-kan-, DBHTK00146). Scale 1:1.




Fig. 10. 1. (119). Stoneware jug (s2-kan-45, DBPO7814). Scale 1:1. (After J.-E Dilz, in Janssen 1983:208).




Fig. 10. 1. (121). *Vetro a fili* beaker lid, with white, colourless and gold thread, (gl-dek-5, DBPO7804). Scale 1:1. (After K. Post, in Jacobs and Graas 1983:239).




Fig. 10. 2. (3). Faience handled cup, (f-kop-11, MAWT8912). Scale 3:4.




Fig. 10.2. (5). Pasglas with rosette prunts and gilding, (gl-bek-34a, MAWT8908). Scale 3:4.




Fig. 10. 2. (8). Goblet with heart-shaped stem and wings (gl-kel-18, MAWT8906). Scale 1:1.






Fig. 10. 2. (11). Drinking dish of *lattimo* glass, (gl-dri-, MAWT8911). Scale 1:1.





Fig. 10. 2. (14). Straight necked *vetro a fili en retorti* jug, (gl-kan-, MAWT8901). Scale 3:4.




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Appendix 1.

Glossary of Dutch and technical terms

à la façon d'Angleterre (facon d'Angleterre) (F)	Collective term form glassware produced at the end of the seventeenth and early eighteenth centuries 'in the style of England'.
à la façon de Venise (façon de Venise) (F)	Collective term form glassware produced during the sixteenth and seventeenth centuries "in the style of Venice".
Afkolfglas (NL)	Breast milk cups, for use in feeding infants
Afvalkuil, afvalput	Rubbish pit
Bandwurm, bandwurmbeker (NL)	A beaker type with a single wound thread on the outside
Baartman (D)	Ceramic jug or bottle decorated with a bearded face on the neck. The form developed over several hundred years. Archaically known as Bellarmine or occasionally <i>Baardman</i> (NL).
Baluster stem	A form of goblet stem, also known as a 'cigar' stem
Batavia Ware	Porcelain with a brown exterior surface
Beerput, beerkelder (NL)	Cesspits. Both different forms of waste pit used during the seventeenth century.
Beker (NL)	Beaker (E), Becher (D)
Berkemeier (NL)	<i>Berkmeyer</i> (D). The forerunner of the <i>roemer</i> . Sixteenth century forest glass drinking vessel with a straight sided bowl and a wide stem decorated with rows of thorned prunts.
Bierpul (NL)	Tankard
Blanc de Chine	Plain white faience flatware and vessels made of in the form of white undecorated porcelain
Blauwerk (NL)	The decoration of stoneware jugs with patches of cobalt blue glaze. This was made famous by the Westerwald manufacturing region.
Bord, borden (NL)	A plate. This name is now used to refer to flatware between 16 and 24cm (Schaefer 1998:440).
Borstglas (NL)	A nipple-shield for use during breastfeeding.
Braamnoppen (NL)	Raspberry prunt (E). A type of decorative prunt in the shape of a raspberry.
Crizzling, crizzled	A form of glass decay, causing multiple small fracture lines in the glass surface.
Capucijnerware, Capuchin ware	See Batavia ware
Delftware	A form of tin-glazed earthenware or faience, produced in Delft during the seventeenth century. Its designs were influenced by European maiolica and Asiatic porcelain.

Appendix 1: Glossary

The ‘Deventer Code’	Common term used to describe the ‘ <i>Classificatiesysteem voor post-middeleeuws aardewerk en glas</i> ’, a classification system devised for glass and ceramics from cesspits, first constructed in 1989 (Bitter, Ostkamp, and Jaspers 2012)
Drinkschaal (NL)	A shallow drinking dish, normally on a raised foot.
Dutch porcelain	(See ‘Delftware’)
Façon de Venise	Glassware made in Northern Europe in the style of Venetian made products
Faience	A form of tin-glazed earthenware. It differs from maiolica in that the vessel is glazed front and back with tin-glaze (Hurst, Neal, and van Beuningen 1986:120).
Fles, Flessen (NL)	Bottle, bottles
Fluitglas (NL)	A goblet type with a very long conical bowl.
Generality Lands	The provinces of North-Brabant and Limburg which were intermittently under the control of the Northern Netherlands during the seventeenth century
Honingraatpatroon (NL)	A decorative pattern resembling honeycomb, usually mould blown

Appendix 1: Glossary

Pimpeltje (NL)	Small trumpet-shaped cup from glass or porcelain used for the consumption of alcoholic spirits.
Plateel, platelen (NL)	Historic term for items of flatware
Porselein, Chine	Porcelain
Prunt, prunts	A type of decoration common on beakers and goblets, taking the form of a small blob of glass applied to the vessel wall, often shaped by stamping, pulling, gilding or the addition of coloured beads.
Ringeloor (NL)	Slip decoration on ceramics formed into concentric circles
Pulle (NL)	See <i>Snelle</i>
Rampjaar (NL)	The ‘disaster year’ of 1672, when the Netherlands was attacked by the French, English, and Bishops of Münster and Cologne. Large parts of the country were successfully captured and occupied by foreign forces.
Roemer (NL)	Rummer (E), <i>Römer</i> (D). A forest glass drinking vessel with a curving bowl and wide stem, covered with prunts of various styles. Developed from the sixteenth century <i>berkemeier</i> .
Saucier (NL)	A small plate. This name is now used to refer to flatware of a small diameter than 16cm (Schaefer 1998:440).
Schaal, schalen (NL)	A high sided dish with smaller capacity than a bowl (kom).
Schotel, schotels (NL)	A shallow dish. This term is now used to refer to larger flatware, used as serving platters (Schaefer 1998:440).
Slingerglas (NL)	A style of goblet with a solid stem containing twisted white threads.
Slangenglas (NL)	<i>Vetri a serpenti</i> (I), <i>verres à serpants</i> (F). A style of goblet with a stem form from twisted, coiled threads, like a snake.
Snelle, snellen (NL)	<i>Schnelle, Schnellen</i> (D). Tankard, usually applied to tall stoneware vessels
Stapelbeker (NL)	‘Stacking’ beakers, small footed beakers with a thick applied glass thread.
Stangenglas (NL)	A ‘pipe glass’, a tall cylindrical or slightly conical drinking glass usually on a raised foot. Often decorated with prunts (<i>koolstronk</i>) or parallel/winding glass threads (<i>pasglas</i>)
Steelkom (NL)	A tripod footed frying pan, usually earthenware
Steengoed (NL)	Stoneware
Tazza, tazze (I)	A form of drinking goblet with a very shallow, wide bowl, resembling a dish, usually on a high stem.
Teljoor, teljoren (NL)	Historic term for items of flatware, usually trenchers or platters.

Tranenbeker, tranenpatroon (NL)	A form of <i>knobbelbeker</i> , with teardrop shaped bumps instead of angular.
Trechterbeker (NL)	Tall funnel-necked stoneware beaker, sixteenth century
Theepot, theepotten (NL)	Tea pot, tea pots
Tonput (NL)	A cesspit or waste pit formed of a sunken barrel.
Vleugelglas (NL)	Winged glass. A goblet style with applied wings on the stem or bowl, often in blue glass. Frequently found in combination with 'snake-stems' on goblets.
Vetro a filigrana (I)	Glass decorated to a variety of different complexities with threads of white or coloured glass.
Vetro a fili, vetro a retorti and vetro a reticello(I)	Two forms of decorating glass with white or coloured canes. In the first, glass is made of threads which remain parallel but separate, and in the second is formed of 'cable' twists that create a spiral effect. In the third form, the glass canes are used to create a criss-crossing 'mesh' pattern.
VOC, Vereenigde Oost-Indische Compagnie (NL)	The Dutch East India Company
Waterput (NL)	A well, often reused as a cesspit
Wafelbeker, wafelpatroon (NL)	Waffle beaker. A common form of decoration on beakers, with a bisected spiralling thread, of varying thicknesses. Also known as a chequered spiral trail.
Waldglas (NL)	Potash or forest glass, a staple of North European glass making. Glass of this type has a green tint due to impurities in the ingredients.
Welkommen beker (NL)	A large beaker or roemer used to ceremonial greet visitors to a house. It was passed from hand to hand.
Witbakkend aardewerk	White baked earthenware
Wrythern ribs	A form of mould-blown decoration, in which the object is decorated with diagonal twisting ribs. Common in the fifteenth and sixteenth century, on <i>maigelein</i> and <i>maigelbekers</i> .
Zuigfles (NL)	Baby feeding bottle
