List of Tasks Carried out by Home Helps and Auxiliary Nurses.

1.1 HOME HELP TASKS.

JEWISH BOARD OF GUARDIANS, ANNUAL REPORT. (1896)

Cleaning, cooking food, airing the room, looking after children.

MCDONALD, T. (1949)

Cooking, cleaning, mending.

CHALKE, H. D., and BENJAMIN, B. (1951)

Cleaning, shopping, cooking, light washing, preparation of meals.

NEPEAN-GUBBINS, L. (1958)

Cooking of meals, cleaning, washing, carry coal, shopping, carry water, clean incontinent clients, give guidance on personal cleanliness, shave, cut hair, light fire, prepare breakfast, act as a guide to blind on outing, put elderly to bed, personal hygiene.

ARMSTRONG, A. (1962)

Cleaning, cooking, home nursing, laundry.

THISLETHWAITE, F. (1962)

Clean, companion, wash, adviser, housework, friend.

SURREY COUNTY COUNCIL (1963)

Normal duties with running of the home.

FIG, C. (1964)

Look after new baby, cook, wash cloths, do shopping, take children to school, clean, get lunch, encourage clients to work, make beds, light fires.

SAINSBURY, S. (1964)

Domestic cleaning, shopping, washing, preparation of food, sit in to look after children, ironing.

NEPEAN-GUBBINGS, L. (1966)

Stay in house day/night to look after children, live with family during confinement, training problem families - how to cook, budget, wash, clean, understand H P agreement, how to shop etc.. Get children up, dress, wash, feed them, put them to bed. Shave, cut hair, sit with chronic sick patients at night.

WELFARE OFFICER: BY A (1969)

Educating inadequate mothers in housekeeping, keeping home clean, family budgeting, domestic help.

HARRIS, I. (1968)

Dusting/polishing/sweeping ,Cleaning floors, Shopping,Collecting pension, Going to laundry/laundrette,

Doing laundry in home, Laying fires/ filling scuttles etc., Making beds, getting light meals, making tea/coffee, Washing up ,helping to wash/bath, Cleaning windows.

PARKER, J. (1968)

Lifting patients, advice to elderly about safety in home, laundry, cleaning, advice re eating habits, prepare food, repair bed linen, furnishings and clothing.

HUNT, A. (1970)

Accompany client to doctor,take washing to laundry, ironing in own home, laundry with client's own machine, laundry using own machine, washing large items by hand, mending/darning, helping to wash or bath client, personal commissions, help to dress, ironing in client's home, collecting pension, emptying commode/chamber, preparing meals, wash bits and pieces by hand, making fires, shopping, making beds, polishing, washing floors, dusting sweeping.

PROWSE, S. G. (1973)

Light housework, cleaning, dusting, polishing, washing floors, making beds, cooking meals, making fires, shopping, reading, emptying chamber pots, laundry.

MOSELY, L. G. (1973)

Dust, wash floors, make fires, make beds, do washing up, prepare meals.

MARTAIN, M. (1973)

Train mother, train older children in household management and budgeting, teach family to manage own affairs, pay off debts, teach how to cook meals, wash cloths, sewing and mending.

BUCKINGHAMSHIRE C. C. (1973)

Caring for the wellbeing of the client, cleaning, cooking food, bed making, care of children, letter writing, lighting fires, washing, cleaning surfaces, dressing clients, collecting prescriptions, shopping, ironing, clean floors/windows, collecting pensions.

HAMMERSMITH L. B. (1974)

Shopping, rent, prepare cooked meal, cleaning, change cloths, errands,

handwashing, prepare snack, personal attention, paperwork, collect pension, make tea, make tea/snack, light fire.

MARKS, J. (1975)

Cleaning - windows, oven, cupboards, paintwork,

Laundry - incontinent, ironing, ironing in own home,

Shopping - shopping in own time, collect pension,

Cooking - prepare meals,

Personal tasks - emptying commode or chamber, cutting toenails, dressing, bathing or washing all over, getting client in/out of bed, washing hair, washing hands and face, getting client to toilet, undressing,

Others - cleaning windows, making beds, making fires/carrying coal, small household repairs, sewing, going out, writing letters, gardening, caring for children, redecorating,

Unofficial help - gardening, shopping, collecting prescriptions, paying bills, cooking, help to bed.

HUTCHINSON, W. (1975)

Make tea, make client comfortable in bed/chair, cook meals, polishing, washing paintwork, shopping, cleaning up mess (dirty cats etc), laundry, heating water, listening to people's troubles, cleaning incontinent clients, cleaning cloths, washing underwear, cleaning toilets/baths etc..

AVON C. C. (1976)

Cleaning, shopping, laundry, make tea, prepare/cook meal, personal attention, fire lighting.

HAMMERSMITH L. B. (1976)

Helping to train inadequate mothers, escorting children to day nurseries and schools.

HILLINGDON L. B. (1977)

Cleaning, shopping, cooking, clean - windows, lighting fires, laundry, sewing, personal washing, arranging services - aids, T V, nurse.

WARWICKSHIRE C.C. (1977)

Cleaning, washing, budgeting, prepare vegetables, cleaning windows, ironing, look after children, shopping, cooking.

ROCHDALE M. B. (1977)

Keep home clean and tidy, prepare and serve meals, assist client in getting up and dressing, helping patient to toilet, light fires, shopping and errands, send for doctor, care for children and young families.

PAYNE, C. (1977)

Create a sense of security and trust for mentally ill, encourage client to do housework, help client with social contacts, domestic work, accompany client to hospital, modify client's behaviour, keep social worker and Dr. informed of client's progress, stimulate child speech, toilet train child, provide practical support to allow medical and social work treatment to have best effects.

HUNT, S. (1977)

Encourage and nearly bully client into continuing exercises every day, solve client's problems involving welfare rights - aids and adaptations - medical and social problems, help with application for supplementary benefit - heating allowance and ENPs, help client appeal against decisions, washing hair and helping clients do things for themselves.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT TRAINING BOARD (1978)

"1. To clean and tidy the client's home. The home help (HH) should concentrate on those tasks unable to be carried out by the client, using the appropriate domestic appliances and equipment as available - sweeping, dusting, washing dishes, vacuuming, polishing, cleaning floors, bathrooms, kitchens etc..

2. To bring in coal, light fires and boilers.

3. To launder clothes- using Clients machine
taking cloths to laundrette
washing personal items/soiled linen by hand
preparing clothes/incontinent laundry
for collection

4. To iron clothes

5. To mend, darn clothes

6. To make beds, change bed linen

7. To assist another Home Help or 'Blitz' cleaning squad with the cleaning of an exceptionally dirty or infested home

8. To shop for food, household commodities

9. To collect pensions, prescriptions, pay bills for clients

10. To prepare and cook meals, including main meals, breakfast, supper, snacks and drinks

11. To use telephone for clients to contact doctor, emergency services or make appointments

12. To deal with callers to client's home

13. When other forms of assistance are not available to accompany client to hospital/doctor and if authorised by the Home Help Organiser (HHO) to use own car or authority's car

14. To care for children in the family ensuring they are fed and clean

15. To assist in the home care of nursing or expectant mothers and babies

16. To deliver children to school

17. To show an understanding of the client's needs and the home circumstances

18. To report to the Home Help Organiser on the condition of the client and to be alive to any significant change in the client's behaviour, needs or circumstances

19. To co-operate and liaise with Social Workers, Community Workers and Area Health staff to achieve the proper care of the client

20. To establish a relationship with the client to ensure that the service and the helpers are acceptable, by communicating with the client, giving support to those clients under stress, and providing a degree of companionship and link with the community

21. To carry out those personal and caring tasks that are not those of a nurse but those which could normally be expected to be undertaken by a member of the client's family

e.g. Assisting clients in and out of bed

Assisting clients to get dressed/undressed

- Assisting clients to wash face, hands, hair, brush hair
- Assisting clients to commode/toilet
- Emptying commodes, disposing of incontinent pads, cleaning clients after soiling or wetting
- 22. If agreed by HHO, GP and nurse to administer medicines
- 23. To encourage clients to use aids provided and if agreed with the nurse and HHO to assist clients with use of aids/artificial limbs
- 24. To write or read letters, complete form for blind clients
- 25. To complete all administrative documents accurately
- 26. To travel between jobs"

GWYNNE, W. D. and FEAN, L. (1978)

See to- fire, toileting, undressing, tea, chat, carry coals, incontinent laundry, wash client, put to bed, shop, collect pension, light fire, laundry, help client walk, dress, feed, prepare meals for client.

HOWELL N., BOLDY, D. and SMITH, B. (1979)

Cleaning, preparing/cook food, making beds, sewing, emptying commodes, dressing, getting out of bed, washing hair, getting to toilet, shopping, cleaning windows, making fires, getting into bed, washing hands/face, undressing, laundry, household repairs.

Take clients to: or visit on behalf of clients- Doctor, hospital, chiropodist, dentist, optician, bank, post office, library, DHSS, council offices, chemist. Take client for recreational outing, push wheelchair, take outings/walk pets.

Heavy domestic chores - Decorating, hanging curtains, re - arranging furniture, laying lino/carpets, making and cleaning fires, chopping/carry/coal/wood, clearing drains/guttering/chimneys, gardening, dustbin collection.

Light domestic chores - Ironing, sewing, watering/tending plants (indoor), minor household repairs, reading/writing letters, completing forms, telephoning, fetching and carrying (indoors).

Cleaning - washing blankets, bedspreads, cloths, washing dishes, general spring cleaning (includes cleaning inside paintwork), Windows (inside/outside), Clean- coal cellar, sheds, spare rooms, yard (Outside), oven/fridge (defrosting), brass, silver, pets, wheelchair.

Personal hygiene/care - Hair care (wash-cut-set-comb), shaving, cut finger/toe nails, wash feet, strip wash, administer/check medicaments (pills, medicines, eye drops, ointments, bandages), deal with disposables (sanitary towels, incontinence pads), Intimate care (washing of private parts), emptying commode.

Culinary/kitchen - baking, preparing meals, checking - larder/fridge well stocked - keep well stocked, making tea/coffee/Complan and other drinks.

Surveillance/contact-Locking up at night, unlocking in morning, check house/client during day, constant supervision, companionship, filling hot water bottle, aiding with mobility/dressing, being around (eg bath time).

HURLEY, B. and WOLSTENHOLME, L. (1979)

Maintain clients personal cleanliness, use of toilet equipment, provide personal contact with other people, help to ensure the client gets appropriate nourishment, help to ensure client is kept warm, ensure that

appropriate surveillance (checking) on client is carried out by the most appropriate means, laundry work in clients own home, laundry work at laundrette, ironing, changing bed, making bed, washing up, kitchen cleaning, bathroom and lavatory cleaning- living room - bedrooms - windows and dusting.

HARBRIDGE, E. (1979)

Prepare meals, shopping, pay bills, collect pension, collect pills, wash soiled clothes, apply dressings, prepare lunch, get client dressed.

CHESHIRE C. C. (1980)

Cleaning house, washing clothes, ironing clothes, making the fire, making the bed, empty commode, shopping, collecting pension, preparing meals, washing up dishes, dressing, washing.

SIMONS, K. and WARBURTON, W. (1980)

Domestic duties, cook lunch, prepare supper, clean home, make bed, make breakfast, shop for client, help client to dress, wash clothes, take client for walk, wash/bath client, fetch prescriptions, make sure correct dosage is taken on time, get client in/out of bed, take client to see relatives, draw clients pension.

HYMAN, M. (1980)

See to - breakfast, tea, deal with bills, washing, beds, laundry (take home), outside windows, meals, shop, pension, personal attention, mending, cleaning, general odd jobs, snack lunch, commode, iron, light fires, repairs.

MALIN, N. (1980)

Supervise and help clients to be independent, help them to iron, make tea, shop etc., training clients in household skills - domestic skills- cooking - budgeting.

DEXTER, M. (1981)

Concentrated support, motivation and mental stimulation, re-education in practical tasks, encouragement - to rebuild confidence, to carry out set rehabilitation programme, keep a written daily report on clients condition to enable ongoing assessment of clients progress, liaise with other agencies, household duties, personal care.

CRINE, A. (1981)

Heavy housework, company and stimulation, observation of client's, friendship, provide food and warmth, empty chemical toilets, collecting pensions, shopping.

SHEARER, A. (1981)

Make tea, collect paper, cigarettes, matches, get client up and dressed, prepare snacks, shopping, prepare and give meal, put to bed, take washing home, cleaning, laundry, clean kidney dialysis equipment.

WHITE, J. (1983)

Understanding client needs, be a resource person, housework,

teaching-guiding and supporting the family, emotional support to family and mother, sitting in service to parents.

RUST, A. (1985)

Supervise medication, attention to pressure areas, bathing/washing client, oral hygiene, walking the client, empty commode, dress the client, cut toe nails, prepare/cook meals, prepare hot beverage, general housekeeping, errands, budgeting, laundry, lighting fire, washing dishes, personal care.

Basic care, bed bath, care of hair-nails-feet, wash in big bath, assist with bed pan/commode/lavatory, take TPR, rehabilitation exercises, assessing patients home conditions or needs, talking to patients or relatives, teaching/supervising relatives or patient, deliver-collect-equipment, prepare food - drinks

HOCKEY, L. (1972)

Basic nursing care:- routine basic care or bed bath, bathing in big bath, care of hair-nails-feet, assist with bedpan/commode/lavatory, taking TPR, rehabilitation

Bathing pressure areas)
Clothing bedmaking) Basic nursing care
Toilet feeding)
Foot hygiene)

Making up fire, hair washing, changing incontinent client, interviewing relatives - friends, administration of ointments, paying bills, collect pension, shopping, support of patient (talk to patient etc), tea making, teaching self help to patient, assist patient with walking, washing personal clothing, checking patient is getting social security benefits

DHSS (NM) 2/77 1977.

"Assist with admission and discharge of patients; appropriate duties may include listing of clothing and assistance with dressing and undressing. Assist in the preparation of the home which may include preparing room; reception of patients discharged from hospital; and helping with undressing.

Weigh patients.

Assist with making occupied beds.

Make beds of ambulant patients and make empty beds and cots.

Help patients to prepare for meals and assist in the service of meals. Serve refreshments and simple diets where appropriate.

Help with feeding patients in all age groups including normal babies and handicapped persons.

Assist with bathing in bed and in the bathroom, with the lifting, turning and moving of patients, including the use of mechanised aids and bed appliances.

Help patients with personal hygiene including care of hair, teeth and nails.

Participate in the rehabilitation of patients in the home, health centres, clinics or hospitals, or dressing, undressing, taking to the toilet and using sani-chairs and commodes.

Participate in giving/or removing toilet utensils and collecting specimens as appropriate.

Care of sanitary utensils including disinfection of baths, bins and buckets after use.

Prepare, clean and tidy clinical rooms and storage cupboards, excluding cupboards for storing controlled drugs and medicines.

Assist with the changing of napkins and disposal of soiled linen.

Answer telephone, take, record and transmit messages.

Assist with keeping the routine records, eg weight charts and fluid balance charts.

Participate in social activities for patients and assist in play room activities.

Assist with the movement of patients to other wards, clinics, departments or hospitals and undertake chaperone and escort duties.

Help patient with the care of their personal belongings.

Where appropriate assist with distribution of welfare food." (Cir No 1977(Gen)35 1977 Appendix)

RYE, D. in HARDIE and HOCKEY (1978)


