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


1.2 Diagram showing the arrangement of panels in the St Cuthbert Window in 1691, based on the order described by James Torre in 1691^1










1.3 Diagram showing the arrangement of panels in the St Cuthbert Window in 1877, based on the order described by Joseph Fowler in 1877²







1.4 Diagram showing the arrangement of panels in the St Cuthbert Window in 1691, showing background patterns of the panels.³




3.1 Table of architectural canopy types


Reconstruction drawings have been made of the architectural frames for the narrative panels (Sections A-C). The probable original appearance of each canopy type, based on firm evidence drawn from the extant panels, is shown in black. Conjectural elements, for which no extant glass survives, are shown in blue. Where the possible locations of original leadlines are evident, or obscure the detail of the architectural canopy, they have been shown in pink. Some details of extant vertical borders have been included; where the evidence only survives on one side, the inferred details of the other side are shown in blue.























3.2. Diagram showing the reconstruction of the St Cuthbert Window's narrative based on canopy type groupings








4.2 Diagram showing the reconstruction of the narrative sequence of the St Cuthbert Window, with securely-identified panels and the probable locations of the remaining panels








4.3 Diagram showing alternative reconstruction of the narrative sequence of the St Cuthbert Window









5.2 Diagram of the proposed original narrative sequence in the St Cuthbert Window, showing subject and image








5.3 Diagram of the proposed original narrative sequence in the St Cuthbert Window, showing the background colours of panels






5.4 Diagram of the proposed original narrative sequence in the St Cuthbert Window, showing multi-panel scenes





5.5 Diagram of the proposed original narrative sequence in the St Cuthbert Window, showing central axis






5.6 Diagram of the proposed original narrative sequence in the St Cuthbert Window, showing alignment of Cuthbert's birth and death.






6.1 Diagram of the proposed narrative reconstruction, showing location of vision episodes




6.2 Diagram of the proposed narrative reconstruction, showing location of prophecy episodes (Section B only)




6.3 Diagram of the proposed narrative reconstruction, showing location of divine assistance and intercession episodes (Sections A and B only)




6.4 Diagram of the proposed narrative reconstruction, showing location of prophecy, intercession and divine assistance episodes (Sections A and B only)




6.5 Diagram of the proposed narrative reconstruction, showing location of prophecy, divine assistance, humility and hospitality episodes.




6.6 Diagram of the proposed narrative reconstruction, showing location of obedience episodes (Sections A and B only)




6.7 Diagram of the proposed narrative reconstruction, showing location of preaching episodes.




6.8 Diagram of the proposed narrative reconstruction, showing location of preaching and obedience episodes (Sections A and B only)


