


Fig. 7 Greenvile Collins, *Mount Missery*. Manuscript drawing in ink and colour, from Collins's 1676 journal of the voyage of the Speedwell.




Fig. 9 Greenvile Collins, Views of Dartmouth Harbour showing the town appearing, as a NE course follows the coast. Collins's ms draft of chart 15, Dartmouth Harbour. Taunton, UKHO Archives, ms B885.




Fig. 10 Greenvile Collins, Leading and Clearing lines on the manuscript draft for chart 15, *Dartmouth*. Kingsward Castle aligned with the Blackstone shows a course in danger from the Homestone Rocks. East Ledge is avoided if Dartmouth Castle and Kingsward Point are in alignment with the gap in the town quay. Taunton, UKHO Archive ms B885.




Fig. 11 Casting the lead – depth measurement depicted in the central cartouche of chart [A, *East Coast from The Thames to the Humber*] in Part Two of the *Coasting Pilot*. Detail, from BL2.




Fig. 12 Woodcut illustration showing angles of bearing being measured on a range of landmarks, from two spatially separated view-points. The resulting angles form the core information for measuring the lengths of the resultant triangle sides, thereby determining the distance from the observer to the landmarks observed. From Philippe Danfrie (1532-1606), *Declaration de l'usage du Graphometre*. Paris, 1597. Oxford: Bodleian Library, B 26.14 Linc. Creative Commons Attribution 4.0 International license. Accessed June 16, 2019.




Fig. 14 [A, *East Coast of England from the Thames to the Humber*] with inset *The River of Thames from London to the buoy of the Noure*, Dedicated to Trinity House. From NMM.




Fig. 15 Chart [22, *The Bristol Channel*], from CUL.




Fig. 17 Chart [36] Kingsale Harbour, from BOD




Fig. 18 Arms of Southwell in [22] and royal arms in 4, both from NMM.




Fig. 20 Details from [23] The River Avon, from BOD




Fig. 21 Men-of-war saluting the King's going ashore. Detail from [23] *The River Avon,* from BOD.




Fig. 22 Greenvile Collins, Algerian and English Men-of-war. Collins's manuscript drawings from the view of Sallee.




Fig. 26 Stern Views: Left: The ship in the Avon Gorge in [23] *The River Avon*, from BOD. Right: Isaac Sailmaker, *The Sovereign of the Seas*. Greenwich, National Maritime Museum, BHC2949.




Fig. 27 Chart 36 [*Kingsale Harbour*] Detail showing town and forts amongst detailed soundings, from MCC, Samuel Pepys's hand-coloured copy.




Fig. 31 The drum of war and interlaced W and M monograms of William III and Mary II. Detail of chart 14, from CUL.




Fig. 35 Chart 30, The River Dee, or Chester-Water. Uncoloured version, from BOD.




Fig. 37 Chart 32 [Carreckfergus Lough]. Coloured second state, from BL2




Fig. 39 *A Prospect of Carreck-Fergus, Being the Place where King William landed in Ireland,* with the *Mary Yacht* central. Coloured version from Samuel Pepys's copy in MCC.




Fig. 42 and Fig. 43 Pastoral and valiant cartouche designs from pre- and post-1688.




Fig. 46 Religious imagery in the cartouche of 17, *Fowey and Mounts Bay*, dedicated to Sir Jonathan Trelawny, Bishop of Bristol and 3<sup>rd</sup> Baronet. Uncoloured, from BOD.




Fig. 47 A highly baroque composition supporting the royal arms. Detail of the cartouche of 5 [*The Channel*], from CUL.




Fig. 48 Chart 4 [*The Channel*], from LGH.




Fig. 49 Chart 4 [The Channel]. Detail of the cartouche, from EUL.





Fig 53. Four contemporary bindings of *Great Britain's Coasting Pilot*. Top Left: Cambridge University Library, Hanson.bb.63 owned by Sir John Lowther, dedicatee of Chart 29 [*The Irish Sea and Isle of Man*] Top Right: Edinburgh University Library, JZ13 donated to the University by the "Good Town of Edinburgh" on 14 March 1695. Bottom Left: Oxford, Bodleian Library, Map Res. 128. Bottom Right: Cambridge, Magdalene College, Pepys Library, 2988 owned from publication by Samuel Pepys, dedicatee of Chart E, *Harwich, Woodbridg and Handfordwater*. An elaborately hand-coloured copy with the charts ordered in a unique continuous anti-clockwise sequence.




