Abstract

Deconstructive Approaches to Indeterminacy in Post-War Music is an exploration of the interface between key works and concepts by the Algerian-French philosopher Jacques Derrida (1930-2004) and post-war indeterminate music and its performance in works by Karlheinz Stockhausen (Pole), John Cage (Four⁶), Hans Joachim Hespos (Weißschatten) and Clare Lesser (Metatechnic). The portfolio in its entirety is designed to embody aspects of deconstruction: conceptual, structural and performative. Therefore, after reading the 'Prologue,' the texts, visual documents and sound documents can be read, or listened to, in any order
