


Figure 2.4 Salviati Workshop, wine glass, 1867, lace glass, G.74, © The Bowes Museum.






Figure 2.5 Mafra workshop, Oxen, 1870, earthenware, C-622&A-1921 © The Victoria and Albert Museum.




Figure 2.7 Master of St. Gudule, *Altarpiece*, c.1460, oil on panel and oak, W.123, © The Bowes Museum.




Figure 2.9Victor Navlet, *Salle des Emaux du musée de Cluny*, 1876, oil on panel, 100 x 162 cm, 887.5.7 ; 958, © Musée des Beaux-Arts et d'Archéologie, Chalons-en-Champagne.





Figure 2.13Maps showing the Bowes's apartment and the spread of dealers in Paris in 1850 and 1870 © Artl@s (https://artlas.huma-num.fr/fr/).






Figure 2.14 Pierre Tetar van Elven, *La Collection d'Armes du comte de Nieuwerkerke au Louvre*, 1866, oil on panel, $56 \times 42 \text{ cm}$, C $51.004 \otimes \text{Réunion des musées nationaux}$.

Map showing the location of the dealers used by Émilien O'Hara, Comte de Nieuwerkerke.



Map showing the location of the dealers used by John and Joséphine Bowes.





Figure 2.17 Photograph of Pierre Theodat Jarry (1826-1864), Penabert & Cie, c.1860.




Figure 2.19Bill for Jarry, 1863, TBMA, JB/5/9/20 © The Bowes Museum.




Figure 2.23 Dutch, Candlestick, 1650-1700, silver gilt, X.4595 © The Bowes Museum. potentially from the collection of Alexander Barker.




Figure 2.24 Auction catalogue showing Lamer as assistant, 1866, TBMA, JB/5/10/4/1 © The Bowes Museum.




Figure 2.25 Bill for Moritz Meyer, 1868, TBMA, JB/5/13/14 © The Bowes Museum.




Figure 2.26Bill from P. Albert to John Bowes, 29 April 1870, D/Bo/E30 © Durham County Record Office.






Figure 2.37German, Ceremonial Staff, c.1770, X.743© The Bowes Museum.






Figure 3.7 Postcard showing Tynemouth Palace, c.1900, © The author.





Figure 3.10 Édouard Baldus, *Tuileries*, 1855, salted paper print, 31.3 x 44.8 cm, RCIN 2584461, © HM Queen Elizabeth II.




Figure 3.16 John Edward Watson, *Plan of The Bowes Museum, Basement and Cellar Floor*, 1870, TBM/5/1 © The Bowes Museum.




Figure 3.17John Edward Watson, *Plan of The Bowes Museum, Ground Floor*, 1870, TBM/5/1 © The Bowes Museum.




Figure 3.18John Edward Watson, *Plan of The Bowes Museum, First Floor*, 1870, TBM/5/1 © The Bowes Museum.




Figure 3.19 Details of John Edward Watson, *Plan of The Bowes Museum, First Floor*, 1870, TBM/5/1 © The Bowes Museum.






Figure 3.20 Engraving of 'New Mansion, Museum and Galleries, Barnard Castle: Plan of Ground Floor', *The Builder*, January 1871, 28.




Figure 3.21 John Edward Watson, *Plan of The Bowes Museum, Basement Floor*, 1874, TBM/5/1 © The Bowes Museum.




Figure 3.22 Jules Pellechet, *Plan of The Bowes Museum, West Pavillion, Second Floor*, c.1879, TBM/5/1 \odot The Bowes Museum.




Figure 3.23Detail of John Edward Watson, *Plan of The Bowes Museum, Ground Floor*, 1870, TBM/5/1 © The Bowes Museum.




Figure 3.24 John Edward Watson, *Detail of Principle Staircase*, 1872, TBM/5/1 © The Bowes Museum.




Figure 3.25John Edward Watson, *Plan of The Bowes Museum, Staircase and Entrance Hall*, 1878, D/St/C5/551/1b © Durham County Record Office.




Figure 3.26 Floorplan of the Russell-Cotes Art Gallery $\ \ \,$ The Russell-Cotes Art Gallery.





Figure 3.27Thomas Rowlandson and Augustus Charles Pugin, 'The Hall and Staircase, British Museum', 1808, hand coloured etching and aquatint, 28 x 22.3cm, I,8.126 © The British Museum.




Figure 3.33John Edward Watson, *Cornice for the Entrance Hall*, 1872, D/St/C5/297/77b © Durham County Record Office.




Figure 3.34John Edward Watson, *Section of The Bowes Museum, Main Staircase*, 1872, TBM/5/1 © The Bowes Museum.




Figure 3.35Letter from A. J. Arrowsmith & Co., 1874, D/St/C5/387/1b © Durham County Record Office.




Figure 4.0William Linnaeus Casey, *Marlborough House: Second Room*, 1857, watercolour, 31.6 x 41.8 cm, 7280, © The Victoria and Albert Museum.




Figure 4.5Jules Pellechet, *Plan of The Bowes Museum, East Pavillion, First Floor*, c.1879, TBM/5/1 © The Bowes Museum.




Figure 4.6Detail of John Edward Watson, *Plan of The Bowes Museum, First Floor*, 1870, TBM/5/1 © The Bowes Museum.




Figure 4.7 Photograph of 'X' shaped display case in The Bowes Museum © The author.




Figure 4.13 Plan of the first floor arrangement of The Bowes Museum, 1885.




Figure 4.14 Plan of the second floor arrangement of The Bowes Museum, 1885.




Figure 4.15Photograph of the display case of Sèvres Porcelain, from Owen Stanley Scott, 'The Bowes Museum – Barnard Castle', *Art Journal*, (1897), 122-125.



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


Figure 4.19 Photograph of the plaster cast gallery, c.1915, TBMA, TBM/11/2, © The Bowes Museum.




Figure 4.22 John Watkins, *Sheepshanks Collection*, c.1860, pen and ink, 32.9 x 47.5 cm, 8089D \odot The Victoria and Albert Museum.




Figure 4.23 Photograph of the Picture Gallery, c.1900, TBMA, TBM/11/2, © The Bowes Museum.
